From the President's Heart:

Bear Fruit as Christ's Disciple

On January 27, 2025, NBTS held her Faculty, Senior Staff and Management retreat to set the ball rolling for the year. The retreat was graciously hosted by Saja Baptist Church, Ogbomoso, under the leadership of Rev. Dr Bisi Ajasa. The theme of the retreat was 'Divine Expectation' based on Isaiah 5: 1- 7. Details of the proceedings of the retreat are available on the Seminary website www.nbts.edu.ng.

As devotion and by way of introduction to the other messages at the retreat, the President addressed all Seminary Faculty and Senior staff on the topic 'Fulfilling Divine Expectation by Manifestation of Fruit of Discipleship' with the text taken from Galatians 5: 22-26. The message on discipleship is germane not only for Seminarians but also for stakeholders, family and friends of the Seminary. This charge is therefore here for all to be blessed by, and learn from in the year 2025.

Introduction

I wish to direct our attention to the two angles where we can demonstrate our fruitfulness as God's garden and Christ's disciples. We must establish the assumption that we are disciples of Christ. As disciples, we will demonstrate our usefulness by bearing fruit. Normally, the planter of a tree will expect some fruit from the tree later. A fruitless disciple of Christ is a contradiction of terms. If there is no real fruit in our lives, we cannot claim to be true disciples. In the words of Jesus Christ in John 15:7-8, Jesus expects His disciples to remain in Him in order for them to bear much fruit.

Dimensions of Manifestations of the Fruit

1. Fruit in Character:

This is the fruit that comes out of the inward life. It is the fruit mentioned by Apostle Paul in Galatians 5:22-23. The fruit is expressed in graces which include: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. As a tree is known by its fruit, so also is a disciple known by their resemblance of Christ in inward character. This is why Paul states in Philippians 4:17: 'I seek the fruit that increases to your credit.' If we develop in manifesting such fruit, we will honour God and enjoy our own lives.

2. Fruit in Service:

This is the outward ministry of a disciple. Having known the truth, we must show it forth for others to benefit. Jesus declares in John 4: 35-36.

'Open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest'. Even now the reaper draws his wages, even now He harvests the crop for eternal life, so that the sower and reaper may be glad together.

Fruits are also seen when souls are won for Christ, discipled by concerned disciples, and led on to spiritual maturity. For us to fulfill this expectation, we must die to the self-dominated life (John 12:24). When we do this, the Spirit of God can make our lives fruitful.

Conclusion

We have no excuse for disobedience (Micah6:8)

and we cannot afford to fail God's expectations from us. May the Master of our souls help us to follow him, through the Holy Spirit and grant us the enablement to be true disciples of Christ in the kingdom service in Jesus' name.

ICHE CONFERENCE 2024

The 2024 edition of the Conference organised by the International Council for Higher Education (ICHE), West Africa Network took place between 24th and 25th October 2024 at the Conference Centre of the Nigerian Baptist Theological Seminary Ogbomoso. The theme of the conference was "Theological Education and Artificial intelligence (AI)".

Six commissioned papers, focusing on Al and research in Theological Education, Teaching-learning Process, Curriculum Development, Plagiarism, Character Formation, and Distance Learning were presented. The presenters gave helpful insights and there were robust discussions by participants.

A total of sixty five (65) people from ten (10) institutions participated in the conference; twenty seven of which joined online. In addition to the welcome address, keynote address, and two devotional messages presented in the two-day conference; sixteen participants also presented papers related to the conference theme.

A new publication in the ICHE textbook series "The Church and Community Health in Africa" was dedicated and launched during the conference. The conference was quite educative, insightful and enriching. Glory be to God for the success of the conference.

HISTORY STUDENTS' EXCURSION TO NIGERIAN NATIONAL ARCHIVES, IBADAN

Field trips are among the ways to learn through practical experience. The Church History unit under the Department of Intercultural Studies, Faculty of Theological Studies, the Nigerian Baptist Theological Seminary Ogbomoso, had a Field trip to the Nigerian National Archives, Ibadan, on 31st October 2024. The team was led by Rev. Dr Olayori Ayotunde Oguntade and consisted of PhD candidates Reverends Joel A. Atiba, Elijah Alao, Olusegun Adegboye, Samson Olomu, Dominion Eseoghene and Master's Degree candidates, Adedeji O. Fodeke, Adebowale Sunday Lawal, and Morakinyo Odunayo Adeyi. The team departed from the Nigerian Baptist Theological Seminary at around 8:44 am and arrived at the Faculty of Arts building, University of Ibadan at 11:40 am. The team met the staff of the Archives, Archivist Peter Ayoade, whom Dr Olayori Oguntade (our Facilitator) and Professor Ademola Ajayi of the Department of Religious Studies, had arranged to coordinate the tour.

The Archives is situated in one of the old renovated buildings of the university near the Chapel of Resurrection in a two-story building complex. The team was taken to the reception area and given a general overview of the history, essence, functions, processes, and sections of the National Archives, such as the repositories, reference room, archival library, and ICT section. The tour guide, Peter Ayoade, provided nose masks and led the team in touring the repositories and sections of the National Archives, explaining more about the contents and purposes of each repository and department. The archived documents were kept in acidic-free boxes and arranged on labelled shelves, with dummy slips to identify them. The tour lasted for about two and a half hours. The team had the privilege of seeing the equipment used to preserve the archived documents and meeting other institute staff members.

The team's facilitator, Rev Dr Olayori A. Oguntade, led the team to the office of Prof S Ademola Ajayi, one of the foremost African Church Historians, to greet and appreciate his efforts for the successful tour. He received the team with warmth and spoke about the impact of the Seminary in fostering the preservation of historical materials, noting that most primary sources for his books on Baptist History were obtained from the Seminary. The team left the University of Ibadan by 2:54 pm and had a smooth journey back to Ogbomoso by 5:25 pm. It was an eventful excursion, and every team member was thrilled with the experience.

The team also looks forward to a time when NBTS will have established standard repositories where historical documents and artefacts are preserved for future generations.





WOMENS TRAINING CENTRE CONTINUES TO ADVANCE

Sandwich 2024 Contact Session: The 2024 Contact Session of the Women's Training Centre Sandwich Programme held between July 29 and August 9, 2024. Over a hundred pastors' wives from all walks of life joined both virtually and physically from different parts of Nigeria to participate in the programme. Some of the activities included classroom sessions, daily devotions, ministerial visitation to Kersey Children's Home of the Bowen University Teaching Hospital in Ogbomoso; practical sessions on vocational and skill acquisition, and a closing programme consisting of social interaction, testimonies and prayers.

Vocational & Skills Acquisition Workshops: Bead-Making: On October 1, 2024 during the Seminary Long Weekend, a workshop on bead-

making was organized at the WTC facilitated by Miss Olajiire Oyeokun a member of the Lydia Auxillary of Ayegun Baptist Church, Ogbomoso, assisted by Mrs Joy Ishola. The latter, the immediate past Prefect of the 2023/2024 set of the WTC gave an overview of what the art of beading entails while Miss Oyedokun enumerated the many benefits of having this skill and various items that could be made using beads such as handbags, jewelries, belts, keychains and more. For this workshop, three styles of keychain were learned: the Ball of 30, the Crawl Shape, and the L Shape. There were 30 participants and everyone was equipped with a new skill and three beautiful keychains which they made by themselves.

Bouquet & Rosettes Making and Flower Arrangements: On October 18, 2024, another workshop was held at the WTC featuring the making of different types of Rossette, lapel broaches, bouquets and arrangement of flowers for various purposes and tips for decorations. The invited instructor was Mrs Remi Ojewale, a WTC Alumna of the Glad Tidings Baptist Church, Ogbomoso. She enumerated the benefits of having this skill and shared many testimonies of ministry opportunities she has recieved through this art. There were 33 participants at this workshop.

WTC Anchored Chapel Services:

Missions Emphasis Week:To round-up the missions emphasis programme of the Seminary for this year, WTC students led the community in intensive and fervent prayers on October 25, 2024. The NBC international mission fields in the emphasis for this year were Uganda, Togo, Benin Republic and Niger Republic.

MAIDEN CONFERENCE AND INAUGURATION OF THE BAPTIST HISTORY AND HERITAGE SOCIETY OF NIGERIA

A twin event of historical significance happened in the Nigerian Baptist Theological Seminary Ogbomoso on April 16-17, 2024. It was the maiden conference of the Baptist History and Heritage Society of Nigeria (BHHSN) and the Inauguration of the BHHSN and her sister organization, the Baptist History and Heritage Academy of Nigeria (BHHAN). The Siamese organisations are to serve as promoters of Baptist identity and core values in Baptist churches, homes and institutions.

At the event, the President of the Nigerian Baptist Theological Seminary Ogbomoso, Rev. Prof. S. Ola Ayankeye, congratulated the visionary leaders of the organization, and promised that the NBTS will partner with BHHSN through the NBTS Museums and Archives to advance the preservation of the Nigerian Baptist history and Heritage. With the theme "Nigerian Baptists and Denominational Identity in a Rapidly Changing World", the Inauguration address was delivered by Rev. Dr Dickson Madogwhe (the immediate past Vice President Ministerial of the Nigerian Baptist Convention).

The lead papers (Nigerian Baptists and Denominational Identity Crises: Issues and Way Forward, and Baptist Ministers and Declining Denominational Loyalty) were presented by Prof Ademola Ajayi of the University of Ibadan, and Rev Dr Emmanuel Adewara of the First Baptist Church, Kubwa, FCT respectively. Several papers were also presented in the conference as the conference drew over seventy people (70) from different parts of Nigeria. High points of the conference included the induction of the national executive of the BHHSN with Dr Gbenga Adebayo as the national President; and induction of Doctors Humphrey Okereafor and Ayotunde Oguntade as Consultants.

Former lecturers of Baptist History in the NBTS, Doctors Dele Adeleru and Ezekiel Bamigboye were decorated as "Pathfinders" of BHHSN while Dr Dickson Madghwe, Professors Deji Ayegboyin, Ademola Ajayi and Matthews Ojo were decorated as Patrons. The Vice President (Administration and Human Resources) of the Nigerian Baptist Convention, Dcn Musa Ubandoma was one of the dignitaries at the occasion.

PRAGMATIC ACADEMIC VISIT TO THE NIGERIAN BAPTIST HEADQUARTERS, IBADAN

NBTS LEARNS TO SAY OVER AND AGAIN... 'Thy Will Be Done'

The 2024 first Semester Revival Service at the Nigerian Baptist Theological Seminary (NBTS), Ogbomoso, based on Matthew 6:9-10 held from Tuesday November 5th, 2024 to Thursday, November 7th, 2024. The event brought together students, Faculty, and Staff for a time of spiritual renewal. Rev. Dr. Diran Adeleke, Pastor of Oritamefa Baptist Church in Ibadan, ministered as the revival preacher in the English section via the theme "Thy Will Be Done". As Day One commenced, the Seminary President, Rev. Prof. S. Ola Ayankeye, remarked that this year's theme is a continuation of the Spiritual Renewal programme held earlier in the year themed "Thy Kingdom Come".

Using Scripture, Rev. Dr. Adeleke affirmed that God desires for us to understand His will. He divided explanation of the concept of God's will down into three distinct aspects as follows:

- God's Will of Decree (Sovereign Will) God's unchangeable, overarching plan for creation (Ephesians 1:11). Humankind has no power overthis.
- God's Will of Desire (Moral Will) God's general instructions for righteous living as stated in Scripture (Romans 12:1-2) and
- God's Will of Direction (Providential Will) The specific, individual path God has for each believer.

On Day Two, Dr Adeleke focused on "Jesus and the Will of God' as he delivered God's message from the hteme Bible passage. He emphasised that Jesus placed a very high priority on God's will (John 4:34); was submissive and obedient to God's will whether it was palatable or not; had a clear understanding of God's will (John 6:35); was committed to doing God's will (Luke 2:49) and taught people to know and to do God's will (Matthew 12:50). We must note that God will not compromise His will and we must also teach people to know and do God's will, as Dr Adeleke emphasised. Not stopping there, he expounded how Jesus knew and taught people that it is God's will for him to suffer; and that the will of God will also be tested in our lives. Encouragingly, victory is sure if we endure to the end (James 1:12, 1 Peter 1:6-7). On Day Three, Dr Adeleke spoke on the three human problems of God's will of direction as:

- Discovering God's will: How will I discover God's direction (will) for my
- Agreeing with God's will: How will I agree with this will of God for my life? and
- · Obeying the will of God for my life.

He admonished that we must trust God for direction (1Samuel 13:8-13, Psalm 32:8, Proverbs 3:5-6).as we earnestly seek God's will (through prayer, fasting and concrete study of the Word of God) and learning to be patient with God. We must embrace complete surrender to God. Learning from the way Indians in the wild break the will of a horse till it follows them home meekly; Christians must follow God as broken people. He also taught how we must obey what is already made known as seen in the moral will of God. Like the woman who is taken as captive of war (Deuteronomy 21:10); we must let go of our old ways of life and learn the ways of the new house; learn new will of the new place and not refer to our past or old ways of life.

SYMBOLISM OF THE SEMINARY SEAL

A new seal was adopted in 1970 for the Nigerian Baptist Theological Seminary. At the centre is a traditional Christian symbol called a triquetra, one of the most beautiful and satisfying symbols of the Holy Trinity. Eternal existence is expressed in the continuous lines, and they are interwoven to express unity. The centre forms an equilateral triangle which is itself a symbol of the Trinity. Each pair of arcs combines to form a "vesica", indicative of glory. In this simple form is expressed equality, eternity, unity and glory. In the sections of the triquetra are the initials of the Seminary, identifying the school with the belief in the Triune God – a basic element of the faith and teaching of the entire Christian Church which the Seminary serves.

This symbolism is set against a background of the map of Nigeria, placed within the outer circles of the seal representing the whole world as the goal of evangelism. Although the primary focus of the Seminary is to train persons for ministries in Nigeria, students from other African countries and from North America previously have studied here. The challenge of the Seminary to each of its students – past, present and future – is expressed in its motto to "make full proof of thy ministry" to the glory of God.
