FROM THE PRESIDENT'S HEART: RELATIONSHIP FOR RESEMBLANCE

Resemblance is generally a thing of joy and identity. Culturally, resemblance is emphasised; it is a matter of pride to resemble one's parents, unless they have a bad reputation.

A Yoruba song I grew up singing states "Mo dúpę́, mo jó'yá mi (2x) tìrẹnkẹ... Mo dúpẹ́, mo jó'yá mi B'ómo ò jo sokoto, yóò jó kijìpá. Mo dúpẹ́, mo jó'yá mi ."

This simply means, "I am grateful that I resemble my mother. If a child does not resemble the trousers, he will resemble the durable top-wear. I am grateful I resemble my mother." A variant of this song is the one sung by traditional drummers, "Eni bini laa jo (2x) B'omo o jo sokoto, yoo jo kijipa; Eni bi ni laa jo." This means one resembles their parents, if not the father; they will resemble the mother. In essence, based on heredity and DNA, each child will bear some resemblance with the immediate or extended family and for that, they would be thankful for not being illegitimate offsprings.

In other Nigerian cultures, there are proverbs that emphasise resemblance. For example, an Hausa proverb states, '*Tafiya da madaukin kanwa ke kawo farin kai*;' meaning 'Walking around with a limestone carrier brings about a white skull.' A proverb on resemblance in Igbo language states '*Nwa obula agwo muru aghaghi inwe odu ogologo*'. It's English translation is 'Every offspring of a reptile (snake) must have a long tail.' These illustrate how resemblance naturally rubs off on people.

What is then is resemblance? Resemblance simply means to look alike. It can also mean exhibiting the same characteristics as another person; having traits that are alike. In our theme, resemblance emphasizes the necessity of drawing from Jesus the conspicuous characteristics that must be evident in His followers. The word 'conspicuous' here means obvious, visible, undeniable. It describes characteristics that cannot be hidden and that is why even the Jewish leaders could testify about the disciples. They saw the resemblance clearly.

Resembling Christ requires spending time with Him. Acts 4:13 expands on this theme: "When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realised that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus."

This verse is a confession by the Sanhedrin, men who were highly knowledgeable in religion. In Acts 4:8 - 12, Peter spoke. Yet, the Jewish leaders looked at both Peter and John and concluded they had been with Jesus. Why? Because the same boldness and wisdom that characterised Jesus was now visible in them. Jesus Himself was bold. He taught the truth plainly and openly (Mark 8:32); confronted religious hypocrisy (John 7:17-19), and drove out money changers from the temple with authority (John 2: 14 -15). The disciples reflected this same boldness because they had been with Him.

The Jewish leaders knew this resemblance was not from education; Peter and John were ordinary men. It was divine impartation, the result of companionship with Christ. The lessons for us are as follows:

- 1. Companionship with Christ transforms us: A true relationship with Him produces visible results that others can see and testify. Christianity cannot remain hidden.
- 2. This transformation impacts our inward life: What we absorb from Jesus comes out in the open when challenges arise.
- We can be with Him anywhere: Whether at work, or even in casual moments, we should remain conscious of His presence - through short prayers, asking for guidance, and depending on Him. Send 'snap shot' prayers to Him as you face various matters at work.
- 4. Our relationship should be frank, full and familiar: We can speak honestly with Jesus about everything in our lives, even matters that seem trivial. He is interested in every detail, and He welcomes us with a smile. There is nothing that concerns us that He is not interested in.

Have that intimate relationship with Christ that enables you to resemble him fully!

Prayer: Lord, help me to keep a serious relationship with You as my friend and elder brother. Let people see You in my words, actions, behaviour, interactions, and in the way I handle my responsibilities. Help me to turn a new leaf, to improve in demonstration of Your characteristics more clearly.

CHAPTER 126: 126TH GRADUATION CEREMONY

The Nigerian Baptist Theological Seminary, Ogbomoso opened another chapter in the institution's rich history of training leaders for ministry as she held her 126th graduation ceremony on Saturday, June 7, 2025. On this occasion, a new batch of graduates was commissioned to serve in various capacities; having been equipped with a strong spiritual foundation, knowledge, and skills needed to make a lasting impact in their communities and beyond. The 2025 graduates were 503 in all and consisted of the following graduating from each programme: Certificate and Diploma Programmes - 30, Bachelor's Degrees - 81; Post Graduate Diploma - 89; Master of Divinity - 149; Masters' Degrees - 88; Doctoral Degrees - 66.

A very significant milestone in this year's graduation was the certification and graduation of 175 Alumni of NBTS who had benefited from the affiliation of NBTS with University of Jos. One hundred and thirty of these were at Masters' level and forty five at doctoral level in various areas of specialisation. The long-awaited certification was received with appreciation as the Seminary President, Rev. Prof. S. Ola Ayankeye, ably led by the Convention President, Rev. Dr Israel Adelani Akanji gave a brief history and congratulated the recipients of the long-awaited certificates.

Graduation events which had held before the grand finale on Saturday were the Commencement Service, the 5th Inaugural Lecture by Prof. Simon Adebayo Kolawole titled: 'Faith, Reason and the Quest for Authentic Life: A Philosophical Discourse'; the Senior Banquet for principal officers, faculty members, graduating students and their spouses and the combined Awards Service and WTC Graduation. We give God the glory for the successful week of graduation events.

The 36th International Conference of National Association of Biblical Studies (NABIS) was held in honour of the patriarch of the Department of Biblical Studies, Rev. Dr S. Ola FADEJI at the NBTS chapel between 15th and 18th July, 2025. The theme of the conference was "Biblical Studies and Suffering in Africa". The Seminary, through the Department of Biblical Studies welcomed the presence of Biblical scholars across Nigeria. The conference witnessed both online and onsite participation.

The Opening Ceremony and posthumous award service was attended by dignitaries from the society, and Professors from various fields of study. The Imperial Majesty, the Soun of Ogbomoso land was ably represented by His Royal Highness, Oba Joseph Oyelola Oyedele (Are Alasa of Ogbomoso) and Oba Sunday Oyeyiola (Iba Abogunde of Ogbomoso). The family of Rev. Dr S. Ola Fadeji was duly represented by his wife, Mrs Elizabeth Fadeji, children (represented by Prof. Akin OlaOlorun, Dr Mike Ayo-Obiremi and Prof. Olusola Ayo-Obiremi), mentees (represented by Rev. Dr Samuel A. K. Olaleye), family friends (Mr and Dcns Ogunronbi and others) and well-wishers. The welcome address was given by the President of the Seminary, Prof. S. Ola Ayankeye.

Six commissioned papers focusing on suffering motif from both Old and New Testaments were presented. The commission paper presenters were: Prof. Godwin Nyijime Toryough, Prof. Olusayo Oladejo, Prof. Emmanuel Ordue Usue, Prof. Igbakua Lorjaah, Dr Ochenia Faith Opade, and Dr Gesila Nneka Uzukwu. A total number of 58 articles were presented during the conference, 32 of which were presented onsite. The presenters gave well researched insights into the papers presented and there were robust discussions by the participants.

Financial donations were made to NABIS by the family of Baba Fadeji, the Seminary, Churches and individuals to aid in the publication of the conference proceedings. The participants who were from various denominations praised the Seminary for maintaining a serene environment that prioritized the preservation of nature.

BI-VOCATIONAL AND MULTI STAFF MINISTRY WORKSHOPS 2025

he two-in-one Bivocational and Multi staff ministry workshops held from May 20 to 22 and July 22 – 24, 2025 in the Multiple Purpose hall and Conference Centre of NBTS respectively. The Deputy President Advancement, Prof. Olusola Ayo-Obiremi, ably assisted by the Coordinator, Rev. Dr Olalekan Fatiloro, presided over the workshops. Other facilitators and worship leaders included Rev. Prof. S. Ola Ayankeye, Prof. Olusayo Oladejo, Dr Ademola Oyeniyi, Dr Gbenga Adebayo, Mrs. Dorcas Olaleye, Dr Emmanuel Oladejo, Dr Victor Oyelowo, Dr Olayemi Akande, Dr Olaide Ajeigbe, Dr Faith Opade, Dr Stephen Oyelowo, Dr Ayobami Ayanyinka, Pastor Mrs Chesirri Talla and Rev. About 308 people participated in the May edition while around 103 participated during the July edition with an additional minimum of 30 people online. All the facilitators were present and they contributed to the success of the map twin workshops. There was a practical discussion in each edition on experiences of invitees on the field. The sessions were moderated by Doctors Ayo Oguntade and Kehinde Olusanya respectively. The discussants were Reverends Gabs Awolola, Sayo Akano, and Doctors Dele Oyedokun, Tunde Falade, Sanjo Ogunkunle and E. K. Akano. Other aspects of the workshop included times for devotion and worship, prayer sessions, health breaks and audience participation.

One significant feature was the privilege given by the DP Academics to Dr. Olusanjo Ilufoye to share excerpts from his dissertation on bivocational ministry. Another matter of significance was the increase in online participation during the July edition which included NBTS students from Ghana Baptist University and College partnership programme and some of the fully online students for the first time. We praise God for this progress and pray for even greater heights for NBTS in Jesus' name.



NBTS REPRESENTED AT ABTEN KENYA 2025

It was a great joy and privilege to represent NBTS at the Africa Baptist Theological Education Network (ABTEN) Conference held in Brackenhurst, Limuru, Kenya between July 8 and 12, 2025. A total of over one hundred in-person and online attendees represented more than 20 institutions from across Africa and beyond. Countries represented at the conference were Angola, Botswana, Cameroon, Cote d'Ivoire, Kenya, Liberia, Madagascar, Malawi, Morocco, Nigeria, South Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda, United States of America, Zambia, and Zimbabwe.

The theme for the Conference was 'Sound Doctrine, Sound Living'. The keynote speaker was Dr Conrad Mbewe, the founding principal of Christian University, Zambia. There were fourteen plenary sessions in all; two of them being times for group discussion. In addition to Dr Conrad Mbewe, there were twelve other resource persons from different countries from both within and outside Africa. There were also onsite and online sessions for librarians led by Dr John Kutsko along with Mrs Margaret Tarpley (both from USA), supported by Ms D'Anna Shotts and others.

There were times of lively daily worship, a resource fair (where materials were made available for sale from various countries and providers of Christian resources); a business session; a meeting by Regions and consistent fellowship over meals, among other things added variety and beauty to the conference.

During the business meeting on July 11, 2025; some of those who had served in the Continental Steering Committee rotated off and new ones were elected through their Regions. In all, the journey was one worth taking for multiple reasons. The rich Christian fellowship, the education received, application of topics to theological education and the implications for NBTS are all not to be forgotten in a hurry.

Selected activities of the Partnership and Networking Centre are hereby reported.

LEAH Foundation

n March 3, 2025, her Excellency Dns. Omolewa Yetunde Ahmed (the wife of former Gov. Abdulfatai Ahmed of Kwara State) led her team from LEAH Foundation on a visit to the presidency of the Nigerian Baptist Theological Seminary (NBTS) Ogbomoso. LEAH Foundation is a non-governmental, non-religious, and not-for-profit organisation, established to raise awareness and spur affirmative action on issues affecting the survival and development of humanity. The aim of their visit was to seek areas of partnership with the NBTS for creating awareness, screening and subsidized treatment of breast, cervical and prostate cancers respectively.

The visit was repeated while Sandwich (Modular) students were on campus on July 23, 2025. The doctor in the team sensitized seminarians on the 'big three cancers' and how it is important to prevent them. The big three he enlightened the community on are breast cancer, cervical cancer and prostate cancer. Details of how to register for screening were also discussed and participants had opportunity to ask questions and receive responses. We look forward to good partnership with LEAH foundation, which will be an additional blessing to already existing partnership with the Bowen University Teaching Hospital, Ogbomoso with regards to health matters of members of the Seminary community.



On June 3, 1995; eleven individuals graduated as the first set of MDiv from NBTS – ten in theology and one in Religious Education. Having held their prayer time of thanksgiving to God on June 3 online, representatives were in NBTS on June 4, as granted permission by the NBTS leadership. They extolled the virtues of NBTS – her curriculum, faculty, staff and programmes; and shared various things they had learnt from NBTS during their period of studies which had become great foundations and building blocks for success for them in life and ministry.

The class governor of their set, Rev. Dr Olukayode Oyedemi gave a speech on behalf of the class and each class member shared success nuggets based on how NBTS had been a blessing to them. By divine design, the date granted for this 'come back thanksgiving' to meet the NBTS community – especially the students; was the same date the 2025 MDiv set had chosen to take photographs in their branded T-shirts. Dreams Become Reality

reams may be prophesies, wishes, revelations, warnings, and so on. The Seminary leadership had her own (prophetic) dream and Dr Tommy Oke had his. This story tells of the meeting and actualization of two dreams to the glory of God. Based in Houston Texas, USA but with his heart still in Nigerian and in the Seminary; God sent Rev. Dr Tommy Oke to NBTS to finance about ninety one percent of the building the new Executive Suite – a Seminary dream for an extension of the Seminary hospitality ministry cum business.

On expressing his desire to thank God in a special way, Dr Tommy Oke was encouraged by Pastor Olu Victor of 'Jesus House' to fulfil his heart's desire of showing gratitude to God by contributing significantly to Seminary development. Recalling that one of his children was born in Frances Jones in the 1960s, Dr Tommy Oke deemed it fit to play a major role in the actualization of NBTS leadership's dream of having executive suites as an extension of Frances Jones Memorial Guest House.

Frances Jones Guest house has developed over the years to about forty two rooms but the need for Executive suites where people can relax and have (family) privacy was apparent. So it was, that after a number of meetings since the time the erstwhile President, Prof. Emiola Nihinlola was in leadership; exchange of mails and defending of proposals, the dream became a reality. According to the Development Committee Chairman's report on March 20, 2025 to NBTS Governing Council; the Council, at her meeting of August 17, 2023, had directed her Development Committee to handle the nitty-gritty of the building of the Executive Suite.

The foundation of the building was laid on February 6, 2024 by the NBTS President, Prof. S. Ola Ayankeye flanked by the Chairman, Development Committee – Dr Thomas Niyi-Ojo. The raising of iron for roofing took place on October 22, 2024 and the building was dedicated on April 19, 2025 at 12 noon. Braving the economic crunch, change in exchange rate and the concomitant challenges, the Executive Suite building was completed in about sixteen months in all. Today, the Tommy Oke Executive Suite is a single-storey building of twelve chalets – six on the ground floor and six on the first floor. Each chalet consists of a lounge, bedroom, kitchenette, dining space, and two toilets. There are convenient steps to climb up the stairs to the first floor.

The dedication witnessed the presence of dignitaries on site and virtually. These included Dcn Musa Ubandoma (Nigerian Baptist Convention (NBC) Vice President Administration and Human Resources, representing the NBC President, Rev. Dr Israel Akanji); the Chairman of Council, Dr Sarah Alade, OON; Dcn Prof. Abel Ogunwale and some other members of Council, Rev. Prof. Emiola & Deaconess Eunice Nihinlola (erstwhile President, NBTS and his wife); Prof. Stephen Ola & Pastor Mrs Susan O. Ayankeye (President, NBTS and his wife), Rev. Dr Thomas & Dr Mary Niyi-Ojo (Chairman, Development Committee and his wife). Dr Gabriel and Dr Mrs Ruth M. Oyeniyi (Deputy President Administration and his wife who is Dean, Faculty of Education); Prof. Olusola Ayo-Obiremi (Deputy President Advancement); Dr 'Dele Oluwole (erstwhile Registrar - online); Dcn Opeyemi Fasipe (the Bursar), Dcn Oyeniran (Ag Registrar), Dr Samuel Auda (Dean, Faculty of Church Music), and Rev. Dr Olaide Ajeigbe (The Chaplain) were all present and played various roles. Faculty and staff of NBTS as well as students graced the occasion. The Project Supervision Team (consisting of Dr Oluseyi Ejikunle - the Supervising Architect; Rev. Adeleye Adeduyite - Quantity Surveyor on site and NBTS Physical Planning Officer; and Pastor Akinade - Structural Engineer) were all available as well.

In her address, the Governing Council Chairman, Dr Sarah Alade quoted from Proverbs 19:17, appreciated the kind gesture of Dr Tommy Oke and his family and prayed that all who lodge in the Executive Suite will encounter Christ, find rest and go refreshed. Having greeted guests and acknowledged the efforts of all involved in the building of the Executive Suite, the President narrated part of the history of NBTS. He explained how NBTS had been handed over to Nigerians by the Southern Baptist Convention (American) missionaries since 1979 when Rev. Prof. Osadalor Imasogie took over the Seminary leadership and

that since then, direct full financial assistance started reducing. Now the Seminary gets help in terms of literature, etc. The Southern Baptist Convention missionaries used and ran the Guest House before but now, nationals use it and keep it running. Seminary needs more internally generated revenue.

Delivering the homily, the NBTS Chaplain, Rev. Dr Olaide Ajeigbe took his text from 1 Chronicles 17: 1- 14. In his timely, brief, yet on point message, he called attention to the fact that all people have things to thank God for. He emphasized the importance of good intentions. He stated that good intentions and the human heart are signs of gratitude. God notices and appreciates every good act like he did for David. God rewards good intentions and good hearts, he said (1 Chro. 17: 8 ff). He challenged the participants to reflect on God's faithfulness and that in so doing, we will become grateful (1 Chro. 17: 3- 8a). God appreciates good intentions and good hearts, he concluded. When people have good intentions, God will bless them and people will praise them too. He encouraged that people should not give up as good intentions will not be in vain. 'Keep giving to God', he challenged as no one can out-give God.

Dr Thomas Niyi-Ojo, the Chairman of the Development Committee led in prayer of dedication while Dr Seyi Ejikunle, the project supervisor led in a tour of the facility. Dcn Prof. Abel Ogunwale, representing the Council Chairman (who had to leave the online space at a point in the programme) was also available. On behalf of the Seminary, the President, Prof. S. Ola Ayankeye presented a Service Award plaque to Dr Tommy Oke in appreciation of the great feat accomplished. Cutting of tape and unveiling of plaque was done by Dcn Musa Ubandoma on behalf of Rev. Dr Akanji. Baba Dr Tommy Oke & his entourage consisting of Mrs Funmilayo Oke-Davies (his first daughter); Mrs Ireti Oladunni-Oke Polland (his daughter), his bankers, family members; Rev Olu Victor and his wife were present and involved in the whole dedication programme, the cutting of the tape and photographs thereafter. In his short speech, Rev Dr Tommy Oke testified of God's faithfulness and challenged people to come to salvation in Christ.

Artisans on site were glad to be part of the programme and to introduce themselves. Eng. Moyegun, the contracted bricklayer and his team were present in branded t-shirts. Mr John Atoyebi – the carpenter; Pastor Solomon Adesina – the Welder, Pastor Hezekiah –the aluminium window sub-contractor; Mr Dotun Amao – the door supplier; Mr Matthew Fadipe – the steel door sub-contractor; Mr Benjamin Alao – the tiler; Mr Gabriel Ishola – electricity sub-contractor; Mr Bolaji Amosun – the mechanical subcontractor, the plumbing crew; and Mr Ademola Adewuyi – painting subcontractor were present and glad to showcase their work.

Supported by his family, Rev. Dr Tommy Oke has contributed substantially to NBTS. At ninety-one years of age, he is a reminder of the faithfulness of God and the fact that God always fulfils His Word. We thank God for Rev. Dr Tommy Oke, his supportive family, friends and others who were with him at various times during this project. Dr Tommy Oke and his family were used by God to actualise the need seen for a State of Art Guest house for individuals and groups. Now completed, dedicated and partly furnished, the Tommy Oke Executive Suite, NBTS, is a testimony of love for God, self-sacrifice, family unity, cooperation of Christian experts, tenacity, and much more. We praise God for these dreams that have become reality. Feel free to enjoy

SYMBOLISM OF THE SEMINARY SEAL

new seal was adopted in 1970 for the Nigerian Baptist Theological Seminary. At the centre is a traditional Christian symbol called a triquetra, one of the most beautiful and satisfying symbols of the Holy Trinity. Eternal existence is expressed in the continuous lines, and they are interwoven to express unity. The centre forms an equilateral triangle which is itself a symbol of the Trinity. Each pair of arcs combines to form a "vesica", indicative of glory. In this simple form is expressed equality, eternity, unity and glory. In the sections of the triquetra are the initials of the Seminary, identifying the school with the belief in the Triune God – a basic element of the faith and teaching of the entire Christian Church which the Seminary serves.

This symbolism is set against a background of the map of Nigeria, placed within the outer circles of the seal representing the whole world as the goal of evangelism. Although the primary focus of the Seminary is to train persons for ministries in Nigeria, students from other African countries (and from North America, previously) have studied in the Seminary. The challenge of the Seminary to each of its students - past, present and future - is expressed in its motto to "make full proof of thy ministry" to the glory of God.
